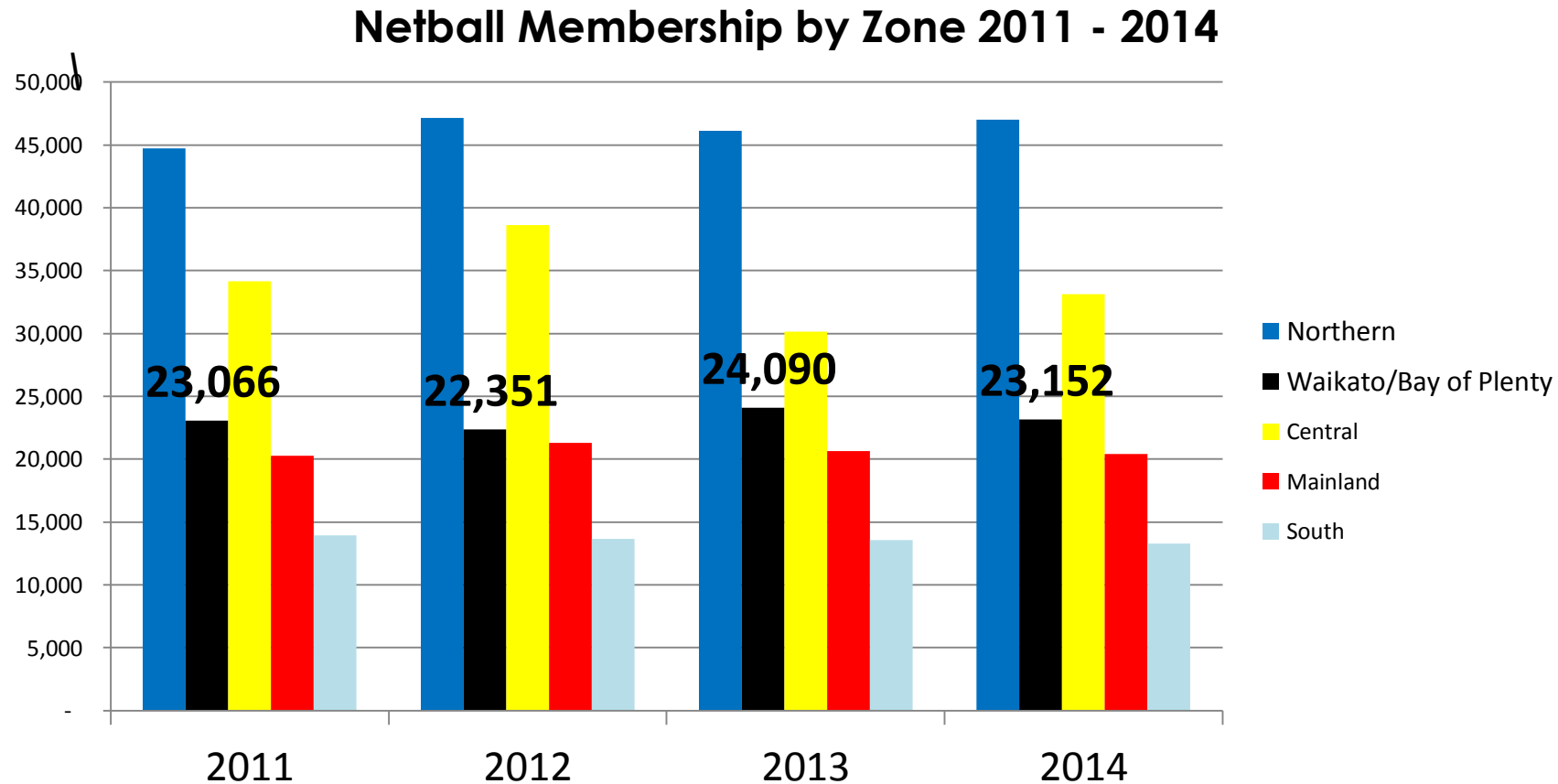

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Growing the game – how we doing?



- Waikato BOP – 4% decrease in 2014 but 8% increase in 2013
- 18 % of total membership

Junior Netball 2014-2015



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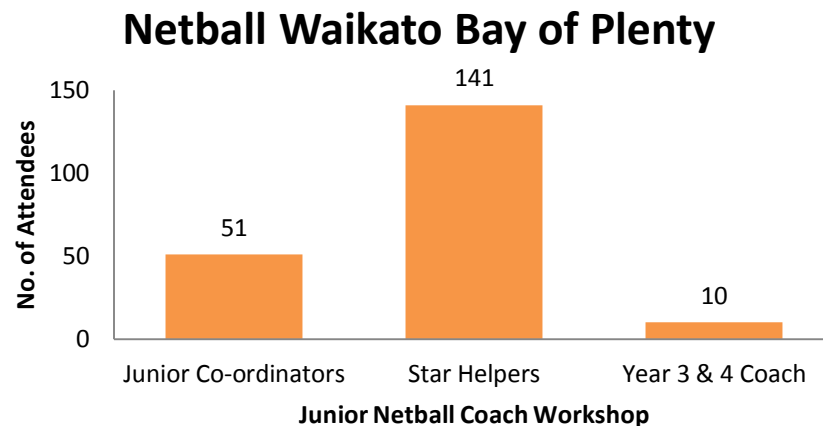
Phase 1: Roll Out 2014

- 67 Endorsed Junior Netball Centres
- 4206 Year 1 & 2 players participated
- 85% Participant satisfaction
- 1275 people attended the new Junior Coach workshops



Highlights - Netball Waikato BOP

- 18 Junior Netball endorsed Netball Centres
- 202 people attended the new Junior Netball coach workshops
- Not part of the pilot – fantastic uptake



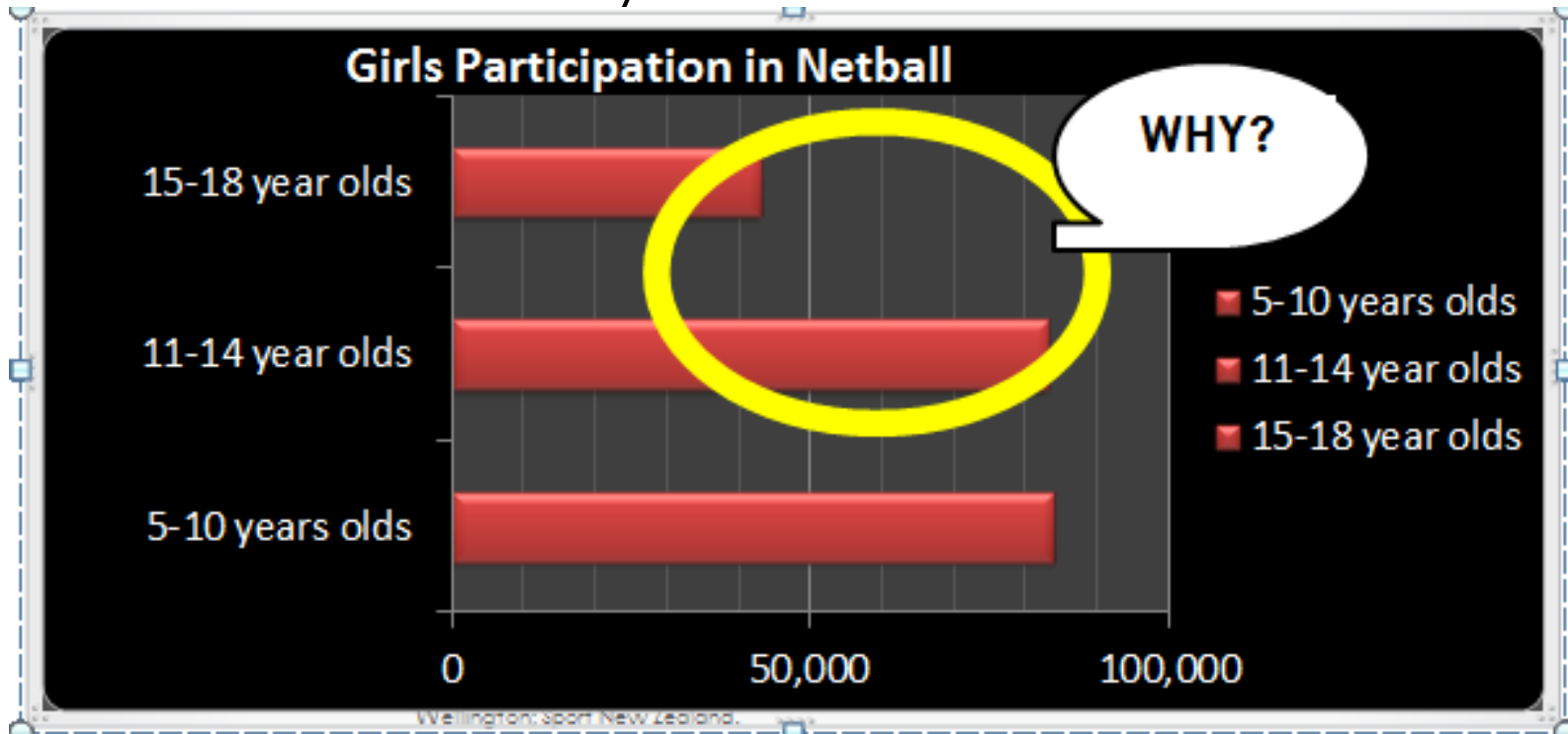
Focus for 2015

- Brand / Sponsor launch
- Roll out of Year 3 & 4
- 100% of Netball Centres endorsed
- Centres can run programme at multiple venues
- E-learning portal and a new website
- Pilot to establish what is the best game for Year 5 & 6

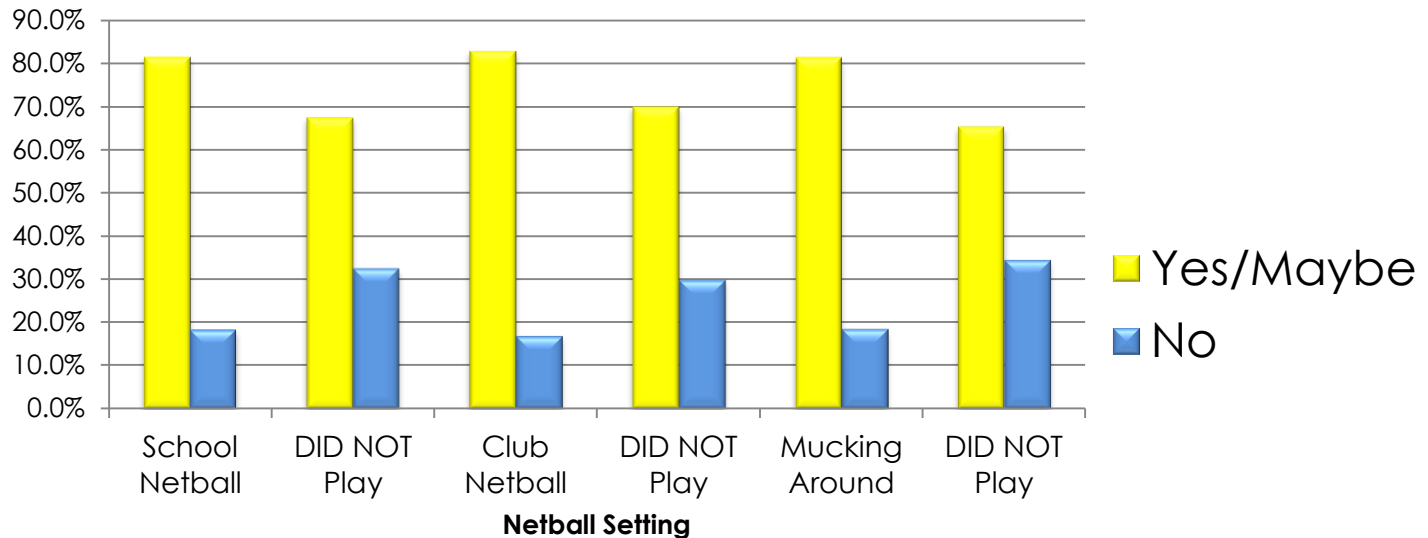


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Challenges - Secondary Schools

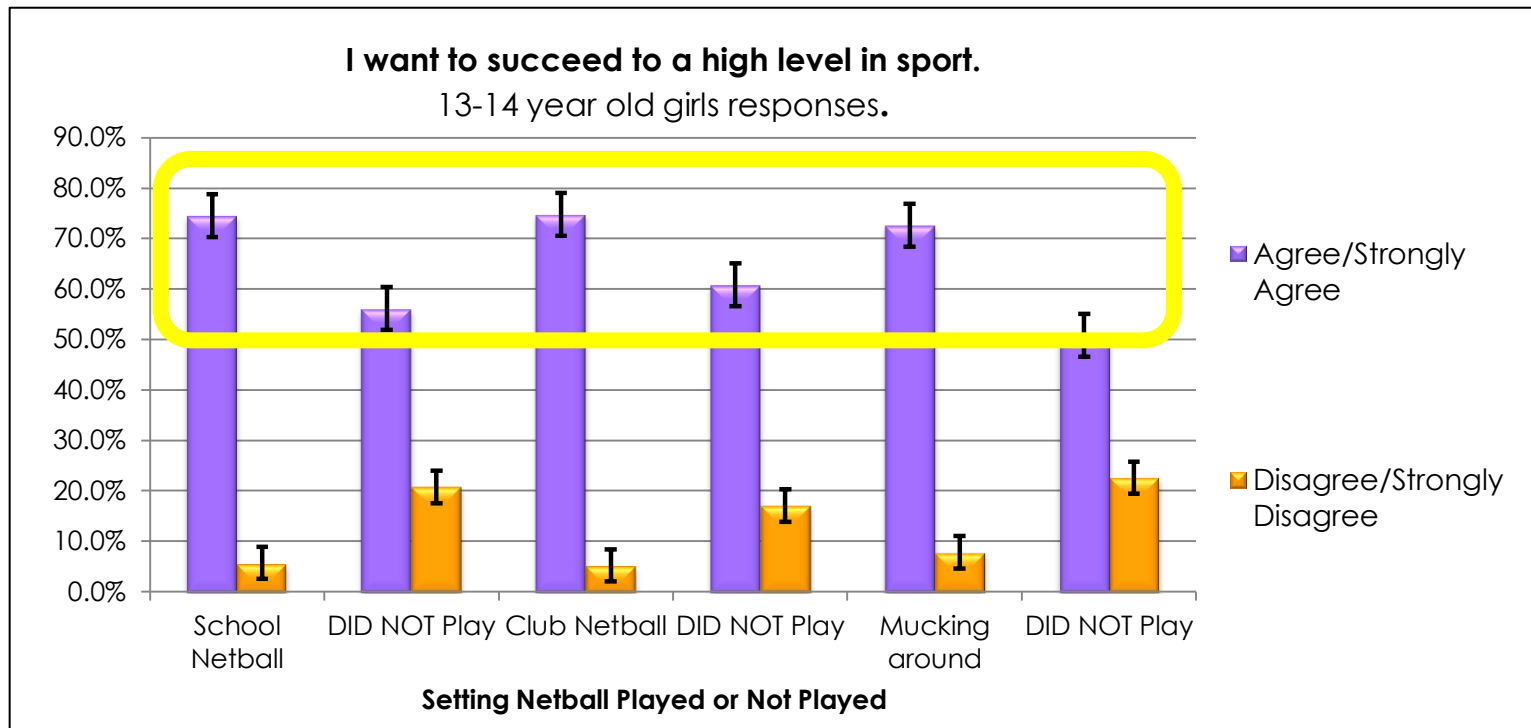
- If schools had more teams would 13-18 year old girls would play more? **YES**
