Introduce children to the sport of netball in a positive and supportive setting.


Develop fundamental netball skills such as passing, catching, shooting, and footwork.

Foster a love for physical activity and encourage lifelong participation in sport.


Promote teamwork, communication, and sportsmanship among participants.


GAME FORMATS



Programme Structure:

The Woolworths futureFERNS Programme is structured into four progressive levels:

Woolworths futureFERNS Programme (Ages 5-12): Focuses on introducing basic netball skills through fun games and activities. Learning the game through modified games.



Centre Requirements:

To run the Woolworths futureFERNS Programme effectively, centres must meet the following requirements:

Administrative Support: Centres must have administrative support to manage registrations, scheduling, communication with participants, parents, and other logistical tasks.

- Identify dates for futureFERNS workshops in their Centre and communicate with Zone Coach Lead and Participation Lead
- Advertise futureFERNS workshops to all coaches that enter a team for the year
- Provide a venue for the workshops
- Host workshops
- Send out futureFERNS website with link to the coaching portal and futureFERNS resources
- Flexibility to deliver workshops and programs that suit the Centre's needs while adhering to the futureFERN's philosophies.
- Organize festival days

Coaches/Star helpers attended workshops: Appoint a Coach Developer to deliver a workshop and communicate with Coach Lead OR identify someone in the Centre that could be trained as a Coach Developer for futureFERNS

Centres must have coaches who are trained and by Zone/Centre staff. Coaches/ Star helpers should have a passion for working with children and an understanding of fundamental movement skills as well as netball fundamentals.

Safe and Accessible Facilities: Centres must have access to suitable netball courts or indoor facilities that meet safety standards. Facilities should be easily accessible to participants and equipped with necessary amenities.

Equipment: Centres are responsible for providing necessary equipment such as netballs, bibs, cones, and goal posts. Equipment should be age-appropriate and in good condition.

Participant Involvement: The success of the Woolworths futureFERNS Programme relies on active participation and engagement from children, parents, coaches, and volunteers. Centres should encourage parents to support their child's involvement in the program by attending games and practices, volunteering as coaches or team managers, and promoting positive sportsmanship and sideline behaviour.
